1.	<b>Welcome</b>	MM accepted the rotational chair		
2.	<b>Apologies</b>	Peter van Gent		
3	<b>Minutes</b>	It was noted that in section 8 of the April 2006 minutes the perception was that the group was discussing compulsory acquisition only in Wattleup whereby it was referring to the entire project. It was requested that the April 2006 minutes be amended to reflect this. May's minutes were accepted as accurate.		
4.	<b>Business Arising from Minutes</b>	The OIC of Cockburn Police Mr Rob Neesham (RN) attended the meeting to address the concerns raised in previous meetings. RN told the group that a concerted effort was being made through patrols with the number of staff being increased to target areas. RN noted the Wattleup area was high on the Police agenda and the service could be improved. RN encouraged contacting 131444 for any matters arising and provide specifics. GT noted he was redirected to Fremantle office when he contacted this number. RN advised this was still the best point of contact. DH noted on a previous occasion he attempted to report an incident at the station and was advised the officer concerned wasn't there and he was the only officer allowed to respond to him. GT noted he had been threatened by a driver of an unlicensed vehicle and received		

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		<p>unsatisfactory service from Cockburn Police. He had then registered a complaint with the Local Member's office. At this stage he was unaware of any action being taken by Police.</p> <p>DH noted the continuance of unlicensed motor cyclists hooning around the town with a flagrant disregard for the community. DH noted there is a greater occurrence around 5pm on a Friday and weekend afternoons.</p> <p>JM asked if Police travelling through Wattleup still detoured through the townsite to provide a presence. RN noted it was his understanding that this was continuing.</p> <p>BV noted that there had been several instances of cars hooning across the paddocks in the rural area.</p> <p>RN advised the group he would return to the CLG with responses and strategies to address the issues raised.</p> <p>BV enquired about the status of the Air Buffer Review. MT noted he had requested an update from WAPC but had not yet received one. MT will follow up.</p> <p>The letter to the Minister signed by DH regarding the residents south of Hoyle Road was tabled.</p>	RN	
5.	<b>Structure Plan Update</b>	MT advised PVG was on leave and structure planning was progressing in areas F & I as detailed at the previous meeting.
